SNAP-8

An acetyl octapeptide studied for its ability to reduce expression lines through neuromodulation.

- i** SNAP-8 (acetyl octapeptide-3) is a synthetic peptide that inhibits SNARE complex formation, the molecular machinery required for neurotransmitter vesicle fusion and release at neuromuscular junctions. By reducing acetylcholine release, it mimics a mild botulinum toxin-like effect topically – reduc

HOW IT WORKS

1**Compound Class**

Acetyl octapeptide-3 (SNARE complex modulator)

2**Mechanism**

Competes with SNAP-25 for SNARE complex binding, reducing neurotransmitter release at neuromuscular junctions and softening muscle contractions

3**Research Focus**

Expression line reduction, wrinkle smoothing, non-invasive anti-aging, cosmeceutical applications

WHAT RESEARCHERS HAVE FOUND

Wrinkle Depth Reduction

In vitro and clinical cosmetic studies showed SNAP-8 reduced wrinkle depth by up to 35% over 28 days when applied topically at 10% concentration.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFO

SNAP-8 is a cosmetic peptide — not the same as botulinum toxin (Botox)

Generally well-tolerated with minimal systemic side effects due to localized mechanism

Mild injection site redness or tenderness may occur

Effects are subtler and more gradual than neurotoxin injections — results take 2-4 weeks to become visible

Not FDA-approved as a drug — used as a cosmeceutical ingredient
